Trends in International Mathematics and Science Study

St Monica's has been asked to take part in the Trends in International Mathematics and Science Study (TIMSS). On 7 November 2018 4R will participate in the Trends in International Mathematics and Science Study (TIMSS). TIMSS is an important educational research project investigating student achievement in Mathematics and Science. More than 60 countries, including Australia, are participating in this study. TIMSS is an important activity to keep us, as parents and citizens, informed about how our students in Australia are performing in comparison to their peers in other countries and to compare programs of study and teaching practices. We will be able to obtain current national and international information, which, will help improve the teaching and learning of Mathematics and Science in our country.

Selected students in 4R will do an assessment in mathematics and science and complete a questionnaire about their experiences at home and school. There is no need for students to study specifically for the assessment, as it will not affect individual students' grades or progress in school. All data will be kept strictly confidential and no individual student or school will be identified in published data or reports.

Swimming Programs

Children from Kinder, Year One and Year Two will participate in the Gungahlin Leisure Centre Swimming Program during Term 4. This valuable program is part of St Monica's Physical Education curriculum and forms part of our assessment for Term 4. It is highly recommended that all children are involved. The program is for 8 days during Weeks 4 and 5 of Term 4. The program includes an assessment of swimming skills and water safety.

On the swimming lesson days KGO and KR depart school at 12pm and arrive back at school 1.30pm. 1B, 1E and 1HV depart school at 12.30pm and arrive back at school at 2pm. 2D and 2MR depart school at 1pm and arrive back at school at 2.30pm.

Lunchtime Dancecore Sessions

Dancecore lessons for Kindergarten – Year 2 are being held on **Mondays**. Lessons for Years 3 – Years 6 are being held on **Thursdays**. The change is due to swimming lessons happening in Weeks 4 and 5 and the availability of a teacher.


