



TEACHING AND LEARNING

Bring Your Own Device – Year 4 – 6 and optional still for Year 3

With technology developing at such a fast rate, it is easy to feel a little overwhelmed and unsure about its possibilities. This information sheet aims to help parents with the transition into the BYODD program at St Monica's.

In 2019, the BYODD program will continue to be implemented in Years 4-6. Should the purchasing of an iPad place a burden on a family's finances please speak to Carmel Maguire, as soon as possible. We do have a small bank of iPads available for use by families experiencing difficulties in Years 4 to 6.

Students in Year 3 will have an option to bring their own device if they wish. We will move to the BYODD program for year 3 in the future. Year 3 students will have access to a bank of iPads to be shared throughout the week. Students in the multi-age will be given the opportunity to access an iPad regularly to complement the class program, should they opt not to bring their own device. Parents will need to discuss this option once the class lists are published.

Why BYODD?

With the National School STEM Education Strategy (2015) and the development of the Australian National Technologies Curriculum, technology subjects have become a focus in education. Consistent with this research, industry surveys show that STEM literacy is increasingly becoming part of the core capabilities that Australian employers need. In order to carry out authentic learning tasks with technology, it is important students are equipped with the right tools. The school has iPads available to students however the CE has a policy that all IT hardware be replaced every 5 years if we want access to technical support for hardware. This creates a big cost to the school and still does not provide the ideal 1:1 ratio of students to devices. Our school IT budget is also going towards

apps for school owned devices, new laptops, Wi-Fi and other technologies like robots and STEM resources. By implementing the BYODD program, students have the tools they need to engage in individualised learning and having access to school work at home. We will also be reporting on Technology outcomes from the Australian Curriculum in our school reports in 2019.

What are the technical requirements of BYODD at St Monica's? Minimum Specifications if purchasing



We are asking students to bring Apple iPad devices only. If purchasing, we are recommending Education IPAD 9.7 WI-FI 32GB. This is the ideal model however other iPad models will be compatible (*This is the same model that SFX are recommending to their Year 7 students from 2018*). The iPad must have a durable cover, preferably with a keyboard. Earlier iOS will work, but may limit the effectiveness of some

Further information will be sent home regarding Apps next week.

Class Groups 2019

Planning for 2019 is now my key focus with teachers focusing on the formation of class groups next year. When considering class placement, the teachers will consider the following: gender balance; learning styles; learning difficulties; enrichment needs; work habits; social needs; health considerations; emotional needs; behaviour considerations and other relevant issues.

Much care and deliberation occurs when forming our class groups. Teachers are highly professional and have the main responsibility for placing their current



students in the most appropriate class for next year. Where appropriate, advice will be sought from the Classroom Support Teacher, School Counsellor, etc during this process. Parents should advise their child's teacher of any issues or friendships concerns.

We aim for an equal spread of both positive and challenging characteristics when forming a class group. Every care will be taken to ensure that your child is placed in the best situation to enhance learning and social development. All children are considered for placement in a multi-age class as that is a part of our school structure. We are now keeping a record of all children who are placed in a multi-age class to ensure placement in a multi-age is shared fairly from year to year across all families.

All concerns should have been brought to Carmel Maguire's attention in writing, by **now**. As Principal, she will make the final decision on all class placements.

Students will be informed of their class placement for 2018 on Wednesday of the last week of school and provided the opportunity to spend some time with their new class teacher.
